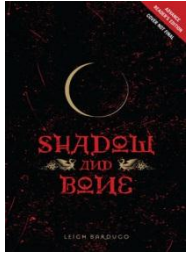


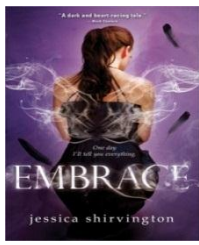

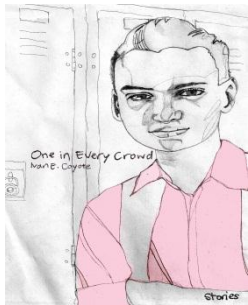
Shadow & Bone

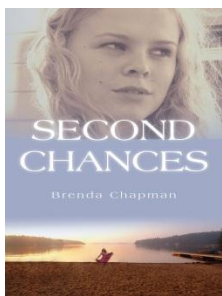
Embrace

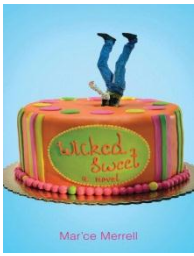
Second Chances

The Prisoner of Snowflake Falls

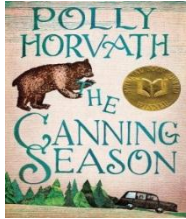

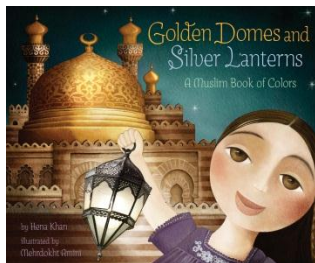


Virginia Wolf

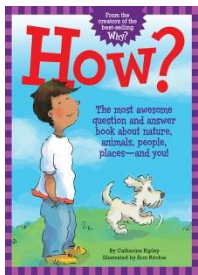


Golden Domes and Silver Lanterns

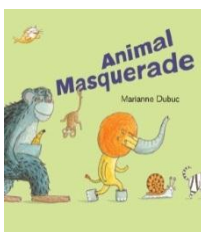

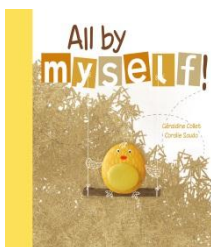


Animal Masquerade

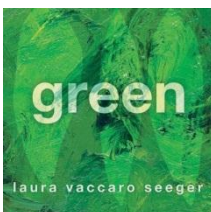


All by Myself
