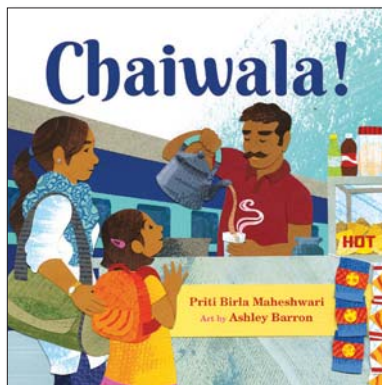

When their train makes a 10-minute stop at the station in Jaipur, a young girl and her mother hurry to get in line for a cup of chai. While the girl waits for her mug of milky spiced tea, readers are treated to the sights, sounds, and smells of the Chaiwala's cart. The aroma of ginger, cardamom,

cloves, and cinnamon sticks swirls in the air. Tea leaves rustle, milk bubbles, and the hot drink is poured back and forth until—*clink!*—the cups are filled and placed on the stand. With a biscuit and a rusk added to their order, it's time to find a spot to sit and enjoy!

Inspired by the author's childhood visits to India, *Chaiwala!* celebrates the pleasures of taking time for food, family, and tradition—even for a brief moment. Illustrated in lively cut-paper collages and filled with scrumptious sensory details, this book is just like a cup of chai—warm, comforting, and good to the last drop.



PRITI BIRLA MAHESHWARI was born in New Delhi, India. She moved to Canada when she was six years old and has also lived in the United States. A teacher for more than 20 years, Priti lives with her husband and daughter in Cambridge, Ontario. The Sour Cherry Tree

Written by Naseem Hrab • Illustrated by Nahid Kazemi

After her grandfather's death, a young girl wanders through his house. As she tours each room, the objects she discovers stir memories of her grandfather—her baba bozorg. His closet full of clothes reminds her of the mints he kept in his pockets. His favorite teacup conjures thoughts of the fig cookies he would offer her. The curtains in the living room bring up memories of hide-and-seek games and the special relationship that she and her baba bozorg shared, even though they spoke different languages.

The Sour Cherry Tree is an authentic look at death and loss centred on the experiences of a child, both strikingly whimsical and matter-of-fact. Drawing on the Iranian-Canadian author's childhood memories, this tender meditation on grief, love, and remembrance is at once culturally specific and universally relatable.

NASEEM HRAB is a writer and storyteller, and the author of the Ira Crumb series and *Weekend Dad*. Her comedy writing has appeared on *McSweeney's Internet Tendency* and *The Rumpus*. Naseem worked as a librarian for a time and now works in children's publishing. She lives in Toronto, Ontario.

NAHID KAZEMI is an author, illustrator, and visual artist who has published more than 60 children's books and has been nominated for both the Governor General's Award and the Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award. She has also taught art and has exhibited her work in Iran, France, Italy, the UK, Lebanon, and Serbia. Nahid lives in Montreal, Quebec.

Two siblings wake up in two very different moods; the older one cheerful and lively, the younger grumpy and irritable. The big sister negotiates and cajoles, trying everything she can think of to cheer her little sister up, but nothing works. She

offers to go outside and play, but her sister refuses. She suggests they color a picture, but her little sister only likes the color gray. She proposes they bake sweet cakes, but her sister only wants sour ones.

It's only when little sister's gloomy mood reaches a boiling point that the older sibling tries a different tactic. She empathizes and enters the gloom with her sister, and offers up compassion along with a gray picture and a sour cake. Together, they navigate the little sister's messy feelings and are finally able to play.

Told with striking conceptual illustrations, this story explores empathy and emotional acceptance in a warm, accessible way.

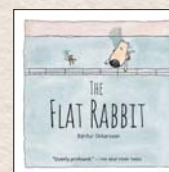

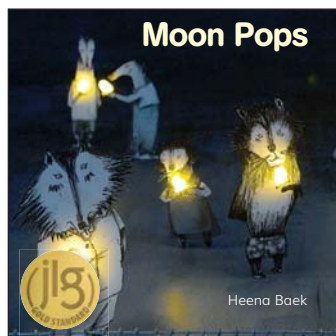

moon pops!—to help cool down her neighbors.

But as everyone drifts off to sleep, a new problem arises. The fabled rabbits who, according to folklore, live on the moon have lost their home! With the last of the moon drops, Granny grows a new moon from the potted plant in her window. As the moon ascends to the starry sky above, the rabbits return to their home, and Granny returns to her bed.

Illustrated in otherworldly mixed-media dioramas, this quirky and colorful picture book spins a new story from the common East Asian fable of the rabbit in the moon.

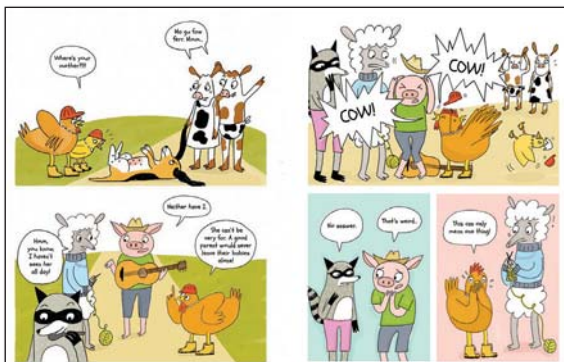
Farm Crimes! The MOO-sterious Disappearance of Cow

In 1921, Frederick Banting was a young doctor with a question: Could the mysterious secretions of the pancreas be used to treat diabetes? We now call this substance insulin, and its life-saving discovery was an impactful milestone in medical science.

Banting and his assistant, Charles Best, worked together in a small lab to test the theory with street dogs. Banting formed a special bond with one of his test dogs and gave her a name: Marjorie. After Marjorie responded well to insulin treatments, the treatments went on to be used for humans with diabetes—and the results were deemed practically miraculous.

Telling the story of a real-life scientific breakthrough in an innovative graphic novel format, the book also thoughtfully discusses the use of animals for medical research, including back matter on the subject, and also includes further information about diabetes.

DEBORAH KERBEL is an award-winning author who writes young adult and middle grade novels, as well as picture books and non-fiction. She lives and writes in Thornhill, Ontario, with her husband, two teens, and a rescue schnoodle named Freddie.

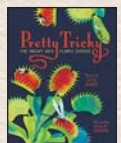

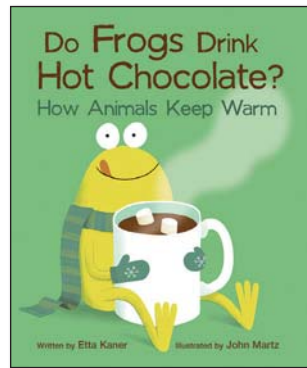

Do Frogs Drink Hot Chocolate? How Animals Keep Warm

When winter arrives, animals living in cold environments need to cope with the drop in temperature to survive. Do polar bears build homes? Do penguins snuggle with a friend?

Yes and yes! But the bears' homes aren't made of wood, and the tuxedoed birds don't cuddle on a couch. Instead, these animals and many more have adapted in amazing ways to survive chilly weather.

Whether detailing whales layering up with plenty of blubber, turtles burrowing into the mud to snooze and wait for spring, or emperor penguins coming together in a giant huddle, this book is full of fascinating tidbits about animal behavior in winter. Written in a question-and-answer format, this interactive non-fiction book encourages kids to predict the answers and shout them out. Playful phrasing and comic illustrations make the content engaging for readers, who will gain newfound knowledge and an early understanding of adaptations in nature.



ETTA KANER writes for both children and educators. A number of her books have won awards, namely, the Silver Birch Award, the Henry Bergh Award, the Animal Behavior Society Award, the *Scientific American* Young Readers Book Award, and the Science in Society Book Award. Etta lives in Toronto, Ontario.
