Darcy practices traditional lifestyles like trapping, fishing, and ricing, as well as traditional spirituality in both the Midewiwin and Sundance traditions. He and his partner, Kim, started a non-profit called Grey Raven Ranch where they have been raising and caring for Ojibwe Horses for the past decade to help preserve the breed and the tradition of symbiotic interaction with the Ojibwe people.

HEATHER M. O'CONNOR is an award-winning children's author and freelance writer based in Peterborough, Ontario. She first learned about Ojibwe Horses while writing for the Ontario Parks blog and guickly became obsessed.

LENNY LISHCHENKO is not a boy. She is an illustrator, graphic designer, and comics maker who will never give up the chance to draw a good birch tree. Ukrainian-born and Canadian-raised, she's interested in telling stories that people remember years later in the early mornings, when everything is quiet and still. She is based out of Burlington, Ontario.

No Second Chances Women and Political Power in Canada

Women don't win re-election. Why? Because in Canadian politics, there are no second chances.

As of September 2021, only thirteen women had reached Canada's top political posts: elected or appointed provincial premier or prime minister. They have represented three major political parties and served across provinces and territories from coast to coast to coast. But, as professor and provincial candidate Kate Graham discovered, there are concerning similarities in their stories: women tend to reach the top only in challenging political circumstances; they last in the top job for about half as long as men do; and, when they run for re-election, they lose.

No Second Chances shares the stories of the rise and fall of women in Canada's most senior political roles and examines the obstacles that prevent more women from reaching for and achieving these goals. Based on interviews conducted for the Canada 2020 No Second Chances podcast, Graham provides readers with a rare glimpse into the lives of female political leaders from the perspectives of the women who know this story best.

KATE GRAHAM researches, writes, speaks, and teaches about politics in Canada. She holds a PhD in Political Science and teaches in the Political Science Departments at Western and Huron University College. Kate is the creator and host of No Second Chances (NoSecondChances.ca), a Canada 2020 podcast about the rise and fall of women in Canada's most senior political roles—a project which inspired her own political pursuits, and this book. Kate lives with her partner, Jesse, and daughter, Flora, in London, Ontario.
