Dear Reader,

I can hardly believe that this fall marks the 35th anniversary since Second Story Feminist Press Inc., was established. There were four of us and a few friends who met many times together, and we decided to take a "second" leap at feminist publishing—all of us had been previously involved with another book company. A typesetter colleague gave us a desk and a phone in their office; a former incarnation of our current sales team, Ampersand, agreed to represent our not-yet-existing books; and the University of Toronto Press said they would distribute the list whenever it was ready.

Second Story's office in Tkaronto (Toronto) is situated in the traditional territories of many nations including the Haudenosaunee, Huron-Wendat, Anishnabeg, Métis, and the Mississaugas of the New Credit. We are grateful to live and work here, and for the privilege of having worked with many talented Indigenous creators, editors, and

That was the easy part. Even creating our first four titles was a lovely challenge. Paying for them was less fun. But family, friends, and even other publishers helped, and within a year, we released our initial list. I think the biggest obstacle over the years has been trying to change attitudes about our kind of publishing. We were often regarded as "fringe" or "alternative" for a bunch of reasons. Our perspective was "feminist" for sure, and even in 1988 that was deemed not part of the mainstream. But perhaps more challenging was that our books for children also reflected a feminist, social justice, and inclusive mandate. That was mostly not done. Kids' books were about fun, and bunnies, and information, but not some of the "tough" or "too real" subjects that the writers of Second Story books were addressing. In many ways, we were turning kids' literature on its head. The catalogue here will demonstrate what I'm talking about. A great part of what we started to do 35 years ago is that much of the publishing industry throughout North America and elsewhere is releasing our kinds of books today.

Our 2023 list furthers what we have always done. The subjects and authors are more diverse and relevant than they have ever been. Sadly, many forms of hate are showing themselves in frightening ways. Our just released title What Does Hate Look Like? (p.11) focuses on the lived experience of young people. New titles that aim to help kids combat different forms of hate, like anti-Asian racism and anti-Semitism, can be found on pages 12 and 13. Two wonderful winners of our third Indigenous Writing Contest are also part of the fall list (pp.2–3), as is a new title in our Do You Know My Name? series focusing on the accomplishments of lesbian, queer, allied, and trans activists. There are many more highlights—have a look inside and enjoy.

We are grateful to all of you readers—with you and our writers and illustrators and so many supporters, we have reached an extraordinary milestone.

Grandma shares her experience as a Japanese Canadian during World War II, revealing the painful story of Japanese internment. Her family was forced apart. Whole communities were uprooted, moved into camps, their belongings stolen. Lou, who's ten, and twelve-year-old Charlotte struggle with the injustice, even as they marvel at their grandmother's strength. They begin to understand how their identities have been shaped by racism, and that history is not only about the past.

JANIS BRIDGER is an educator and writer who has many creative outlets and a love for the outdoors. She lives in Vancouver, Canada, close to where her Japanese Canadian grandparents lived before being interned. Janis earned a diploma in Professional Photography (Langara College), and a Master of Education (University of Alberta), specializing in teacher-librarianship. Social justice, diversity, and kindness are paramount in her life and embedded in her everyday teaching.

LARA JEAN OKIHIRO is a writer, researcher, and educator of mixed Japanese Canadian heritage living in Toronto. Intrigued by the power and magic of stories, she earned a Master's (Goldsmiths, University of London) and a Doctorate (University of Toronto) in English. Living abroad inspired her to learn about her family's internment experience. Lara's diverse creative work emphasizes social justice, dispossession, and carrying the lessons of the past into the future.
