

# A note from the publisher:

Dear Reader,

Being in the 35th year since Second Story Press began publishing, I looked at our long list of books and marveled at titles which some have described as "ahead of the curve." We have a series featuring one of the earliest, if not the first, openly lesbian detectives: the hard-boiled and politically savvy Helen Keremos, introduced in the 1970s by writer Eve Zaremba.









The current Barbie-as-feminist craze came as a bit of a shock to me. Kathleen McDonnell, some decades ago in *Kid Culture: Children and Adults and Popular Culture*, reassured feminist mothers that their daughters would not be limiting themselves to a traditional feminine ideal if they played with Barbie dolls, but rather would overlay their own adventures onto her. McDonnell went on to argue that the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles would not turn their sons violent. This pathbreaking book was followed by *Honey, We Lost the Kids: Re-thinking childhood in the multimedia age* about which one reviewer wrote, "McDonnell continues her crusade to kick conventional wisdom in the butt.... An important voice in an intensifying debate." And we're still talking about these concerns today.





**KATHY KACER**'s books have won many awards, including the Silver Birch and the Jewish Book Award. A former psychologist, Kathy now travels the globe speaking to children and adults about the importance of keeping the memory of the Holocaust alive. Kathy lives in Toronto with her family.

**GABRIELLE GRIMARD** uses various media to research and create the illustrations for a book, but her favorite aspect will always be color. She uses mainly watercolors, gouache, and oil. She adds a touch of wooden pencil for the details. She has illustrated dozens of books and has been nominated for several awards. She lives in Waterville, Quebec.

### College prep or prepping for the end of the world?


