### SYNOPSIS

In *The Wonder Wander*, Diane Driedger explores her identity as a Mennonite girl, and later as a disabled activist woman. Interspersed throughout the collection are short rhyming poems that respond to and subvert childhood rhymes to unpack words that the speaker explores.

In the first section, “Girl,” Driedger is confronted with different cultures while coming of age. From travelling to see relatives in Kansas, to living in Winnipeg, to a year of school in Berkeley, California and then travelling to Europe, the poet observes and questions while she wanders.

In “Riffing,” the second part of the book, Driedger presents a series of poems about her fibromyalgia diagnosis as an adult and the struggles and barriers when living with an invisible disability. The poems riff on words that are part of the disability cultural experience. Through short rhyming poems, these poems question and challenge the meanings of societal views on disability.

### BIOGRAPHY

**Diane Driedger** is a poet, writer and educator. She has published 12 books including two poetry collections and *Still Living the Edges: A Disabled Women’s Reader* (Inanna Publications, 2021). She has been involved in the disability rights movement in Canada and internationally for many years. She teaches in the Interdisciplinary Master’s Programme in Disability Studies at the University of Manitoba. Diane holds a PhD in Education.

### SYNOPSIS

*edgeless* is written as a collection of poetic sequences that illuminate the extraordinary ordinary, travelling across time and space as letters to family, friends, and contemporaries. From epistolary notes composed to his wife during her time at Banff, and a Covid-era call-and-response with Denver poet Julie Carr, to an elegy for his friend, the late Prince George poet Barry McKinnon, the poems in *edgeless* hop, skip, and jump through everyday intimacies and commentary. With mclennan's usual flair and flourish for acrobatic, inventive language, *edgeless* writes the world from within, as his words leave you pressed right up against it.

### BIOGRAPHY

The author of more than fifty books of poetry, fiction and non-fiction, **rob mclennan** has won the John Newlove Poetry Prize, been shortlisted multiple times for the Archibald Lampman Award, longlisted for the ReLit Award, longlisted for the Robin Blaser Poetry Contest via *The Capilano Review*, and longlisted twice for the CBC Poetry Prize. The editor/publisher of *above/ground press*, *periodicities: a journal of poetry and poetics* and *Touch the Donkey [a small poetry journal]*, he was writer-in-residence at the University of Alberta for the 2007-8 academic year, and is the current Artistic Director of VERSeFest: Ottawa's International Poetry Festival. Born in Ottawa, rob mclennan is home full-time with the two wee girls he shares with Christine McNair.

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
