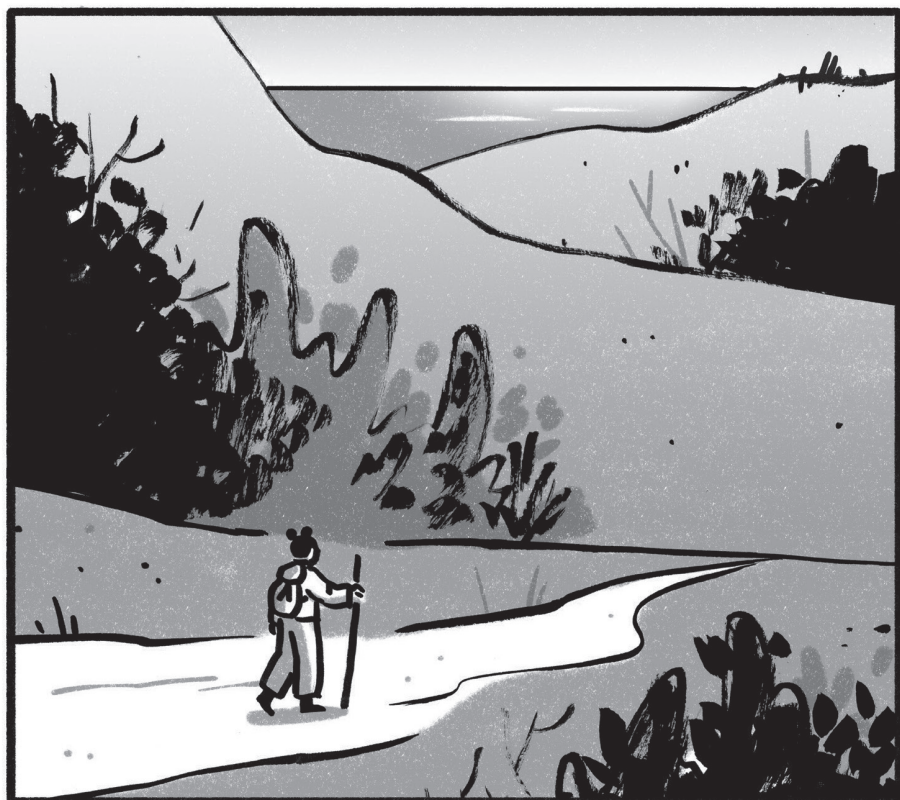

HENRIQUE COSER MOREIRA was born in the city of Curitiba, Brazil, in 1998. As a child, he was very shy, quiet, and observant, and used to spend his days drawing in the margins of books, notebooks, or on his desk. Today he is an illustrator and graphic designer. His debut book, *The First Day of May*, won the 4th Serpa International Prize for Picturebooks, was selected for the 57th Illustrators Exhibition at Bologna Children’s Book Fair, and received a Special Mention for the Bologna Ragazzi Award (BRAW) in the “Comics—Early Reader” category.

She studied animation and film at New York University, Tisch School of the Arts, and completed the Illustration & Visual Storytelling Summer Residency Program at the School of Visual Arts in New York.

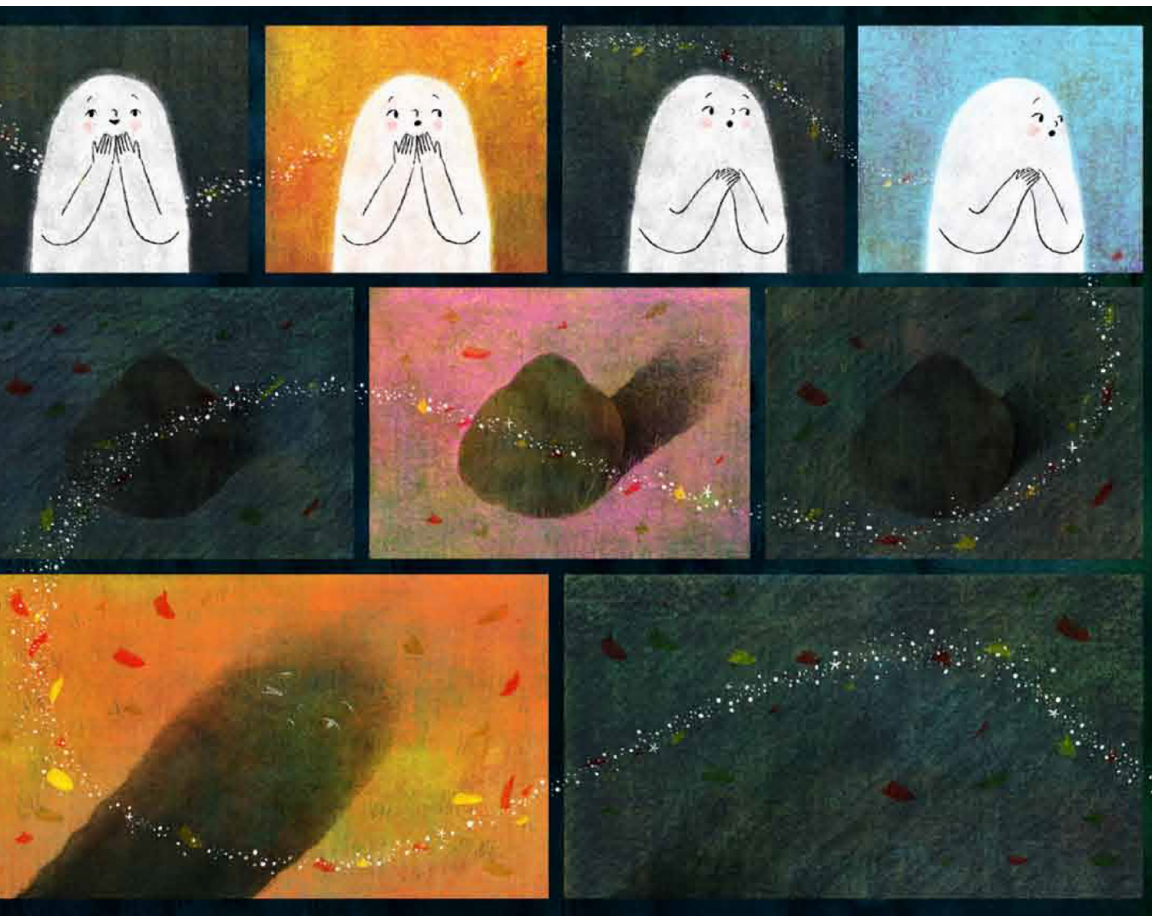

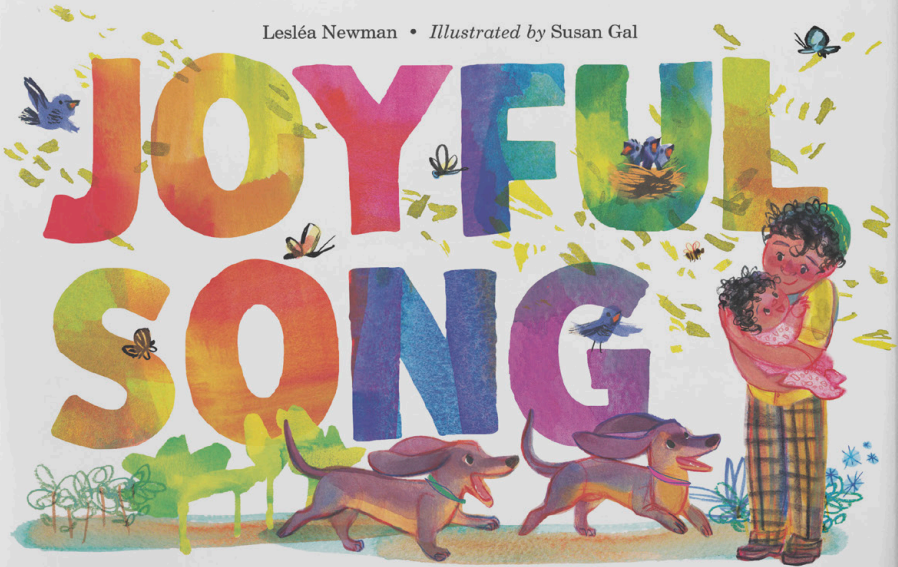

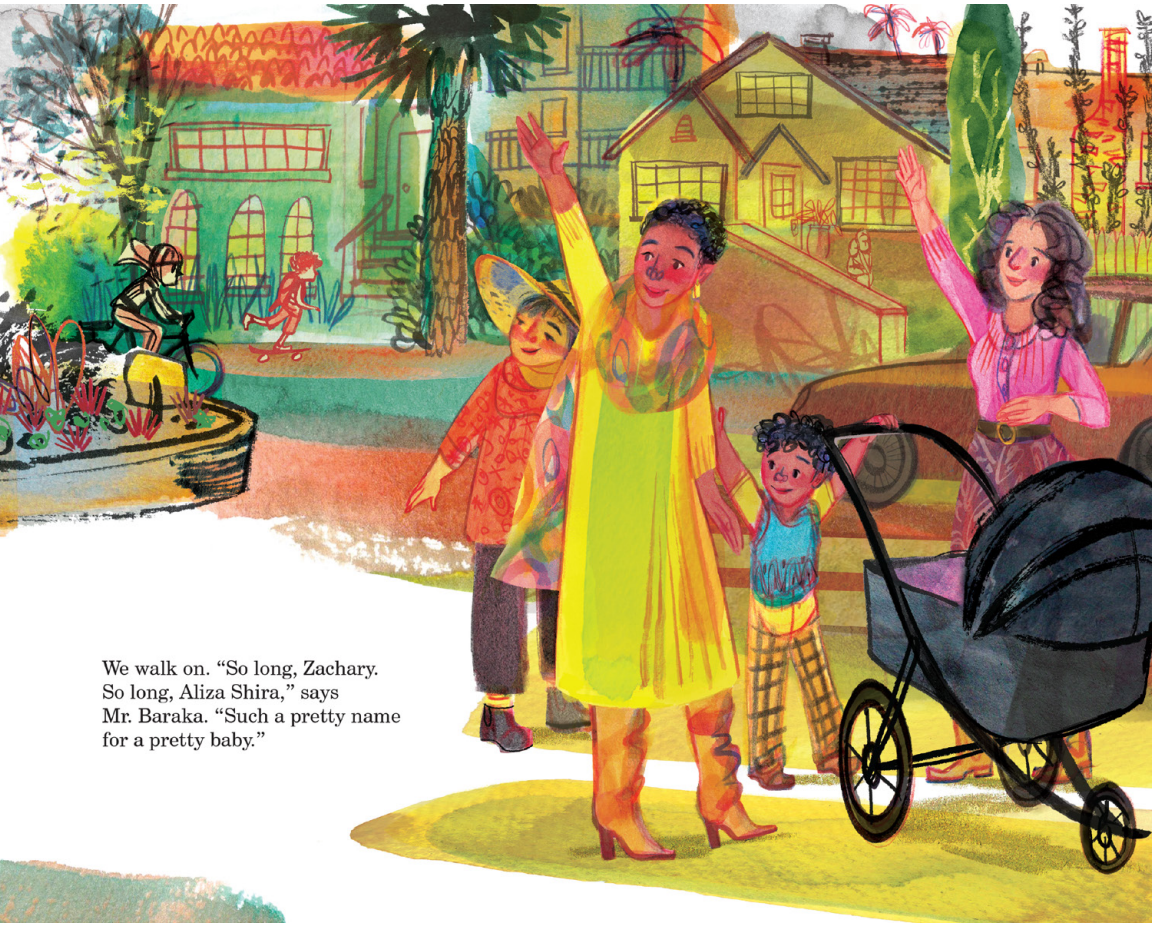

She collects thrown-away produce and feeds it to her chicks and geese—or composts it for the garden.

She waters, weeds, and teaches the neighborhood children to care for the garden like she does: with love, patience, and pride.

And come harvest time, Granny gathers her fresh produce and cooks up delicious meals for her friends and family...or gives them their own bags of yummy treasures so they can cook on their own!

Debut author/illustrator Tang Wei creates a love letter to an indomitable grandma of the city, inspired by her own childhood and a beloved relative. In rhyming couplets and quatrains reminiscent of Chinese nursery rhymes and folk chants, and vibrant colored pencil drawings, Wei shows how one person can create a beautiful green space in the heart of the concrete jungle, bringing together an entire community.



TANG WEI is a rising young Chinese illustrator from Sichuan province. She is a graduate of Sichuan Xihua University's animation program and was a 2021 Finalist in the Shanghai International Children's Book Fair's Golden Pinwheel Illustration Awards. *Grandma's Roof Garden* is her debut work as an author/illustrator and a true book of her heart.

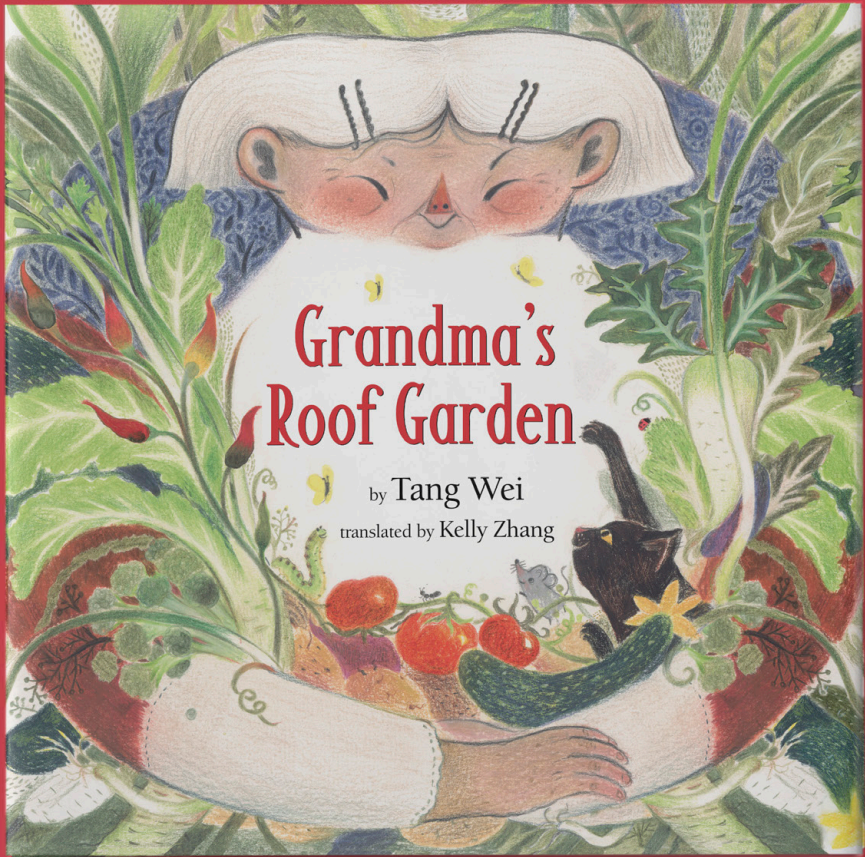

Manuela “Mani” Semilla wants two things: To get her period, and to thwart her mom’s plan of taking her to Guatemala, a place that has always been more of a mystery than an answer. Mani can’t imagine leaving behind Las Nerdas, her band of misfit friends, for the summer. But after she finds letters written between her mother and her disappeared-journalist aunt, Mani’s idea of what it means to be a woman takes flight. Reading the letters reveals both the beauty of Guatemala and its history of violence against women, and slowly transforms Mani from quiet bystander into budding activist.



ANNA LAPERA teaches middle school by day and writes stories about girls stepping into their power in the early hours of the morning. She is a member of Las Musas, a 2022 Macondista and *Kweli Journal* mentee, and has received support from Tin House, *Kweli Journal*, and SCBWI.

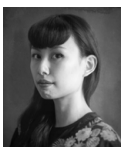

Her second fantasy novel, *A Snake Falls to Earth*, received the Newbery Honor, was a *LA Times* Book Prize Finalist, and was longlisted for the National Book Award. Darcie is married to a veterinarian named Taran and splits time between California and Texas.



ROVINA CAI is a freelance illustrator based in Melbourne, Australia. She works out of an old convent building that is possibly haunted. 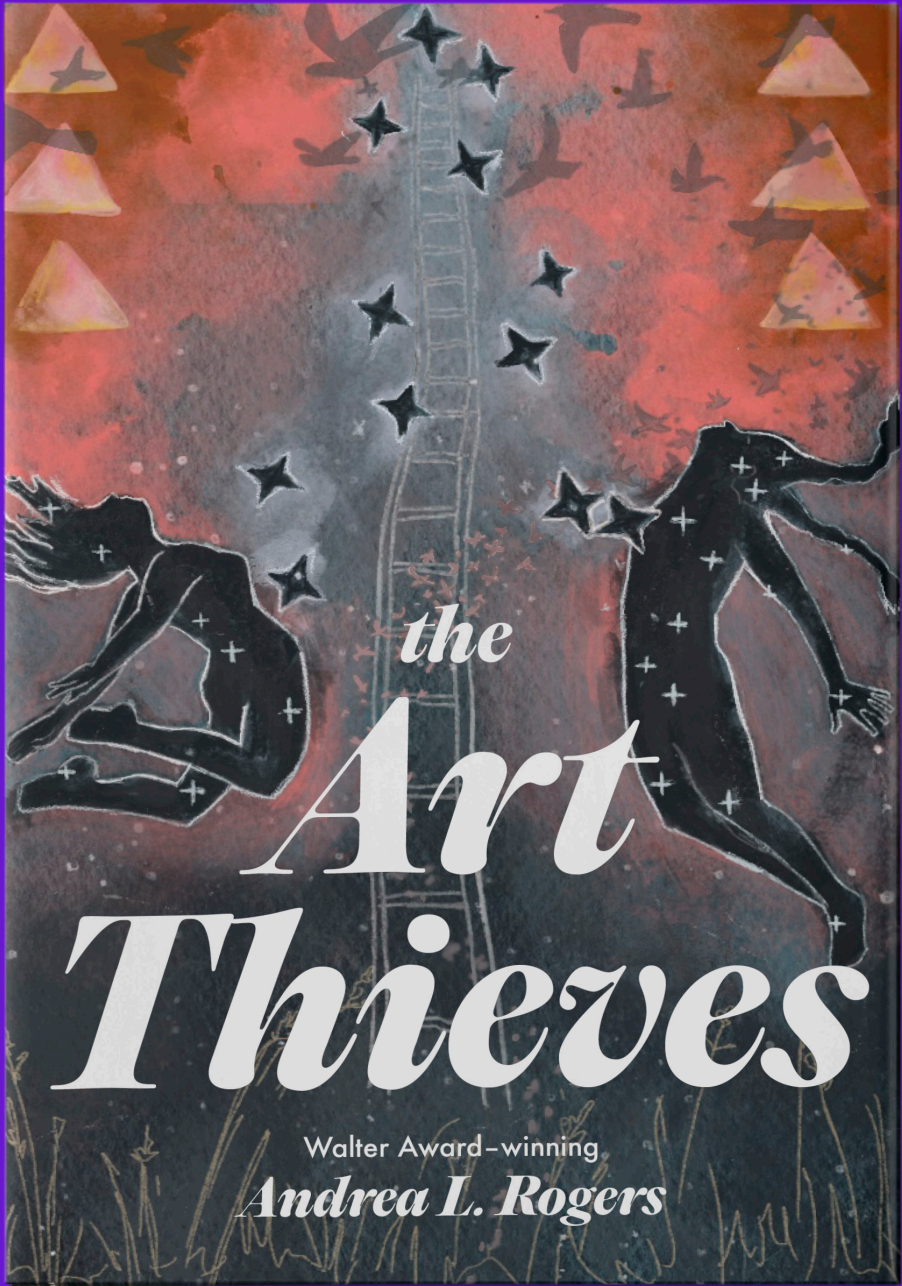

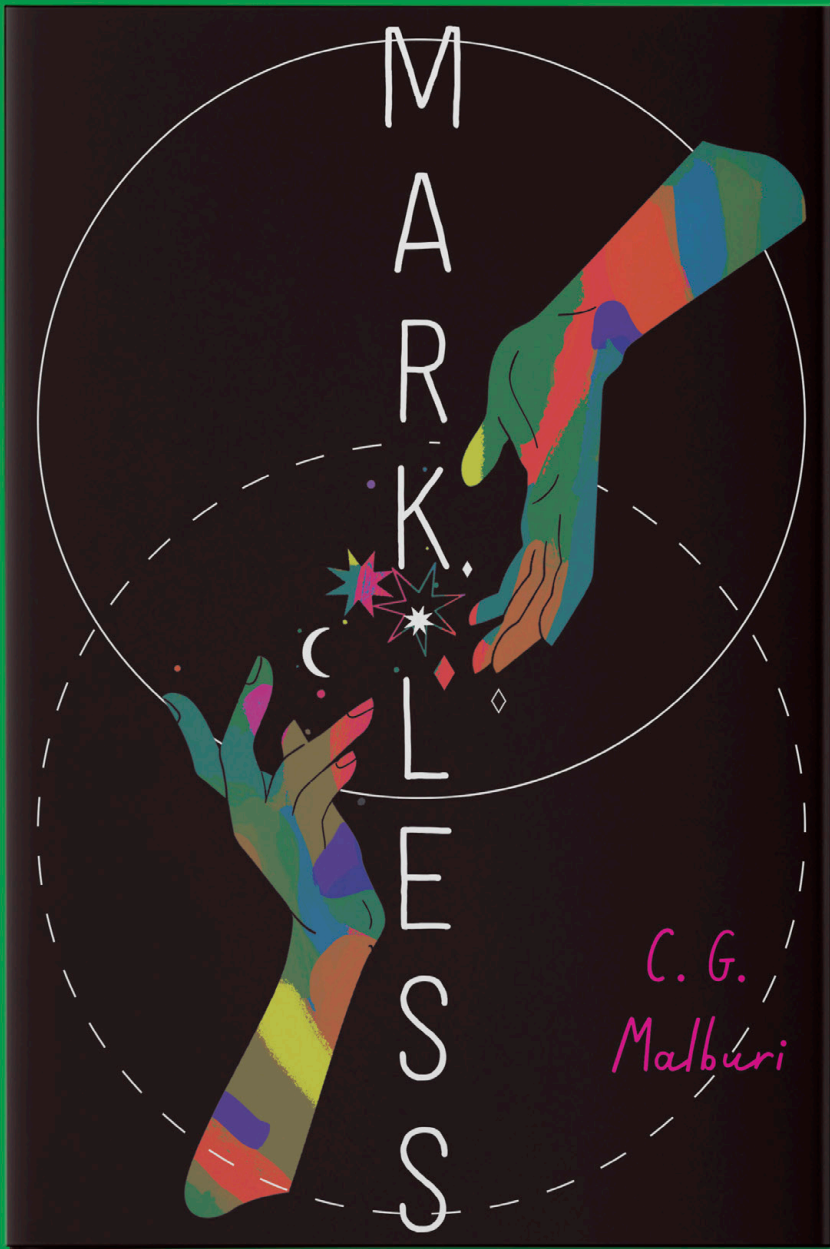

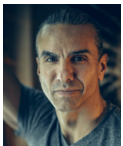

Ezra Cloud hates living in Northeast Minneapolis. His father is a professor of their language, Ojibwe, at a local college, so they have to be there. But Ezra hates the dirty, polluted snow around them. He hates being away from the rez at Nigigoonsiminikaaning First Nation. And he hates the local bully in his neighborhood, Matt Schroeder, who terrorizes Ezra and his friend Nora George.

Ezra gets into a terrible fight with Matt at school defending Nora, and that same night, Matt's house burns down. Instantly, Ezra becomes a prime suspect. In *Black, Queer, & Untold: A New Design History*, acclaimed designer and artist Jon Key answers these questions and manifests the book he and so many others wish they had when they were coming up. He pays tribute to the incredible designers, artists, and people who came before and provides them an enduring, reverential stage—and in doing so, gifts us a book that immediately takes its place among the creative arts canon.



JON(ATHAN) KEY is an artist, designer, and writer from Seale, Alabama. A graduate of RISD, he is co-founder of the Brooklyn-based design studio Morcos Key with Wael Morcos. As an educator, Jon has taught at MICA, Parsons, and currently teaches at Cooper Union and SVA. He is also a Co-Founder and Design Director of Codify Art, a multidisciplinary collective dedicated to creating, producing, supporting, and showcasing work by artists of color, particularly women, queer, and trans artists of color. 

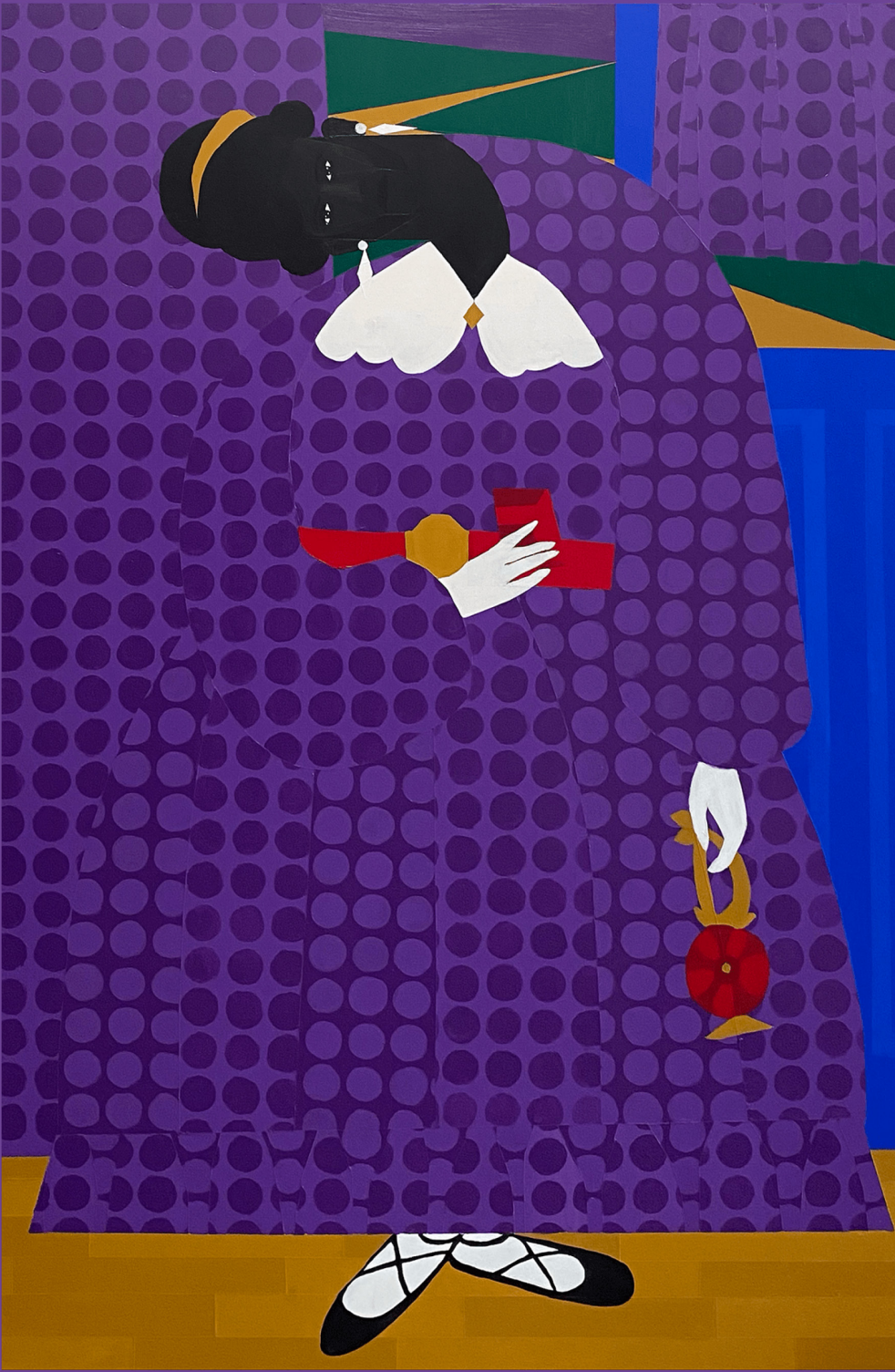

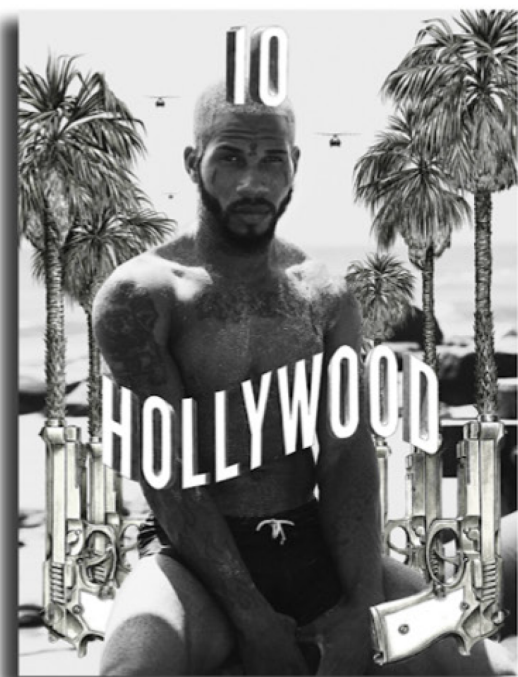

continue to tread. Before *The Tenth Magazine*, we needed artists of the Harlem Renaissance like Nugent and Thurman to claim space. Before them, we needed a fearless nonconformist like Mary Jones to live freely and committed to defining her own agency despite the misconceptions and misrepresentations of her story. Their existence then, and our continued existence now are acts of protest. Our history is a statement of our resilience. All of us living in intersectional spaces and marginalized identities, have created survival mechanisms to navigate life.

The Tenth echoes previous generations of Black and Queer publications, such as *BLK* and *Fire!!*, which established a new voice for the Black Queer community and a new landscape in the publishing industry. The



Tenth Magazine founded in 2013 by Khary Septh, Kyle Banks and Andre Vernon seeks to center the nuances of Black Queer life across America and the world. In the words of The Tenth’s resident historian James Powell, “The Tenth is a collective that explores and examines the global aesthetics of the African diaspora. A coalition of Queer Black people, because we are not a monolith, who represent different ideas.” The Tenth Magazine’s title queers W.E.B. DuBois’s “Talented Tenth” by including and recontextualizing House Ballroom culture’s scoring: “10 10 10’s across the board.” (Cue Pose, Billy Porter or Paris is Burning, if unfamiliar.) The first issue of The Tenth entitled “Masters,” debuted on international newsstands, featuring over 80 contributors and artists, and offered a needed space for young Black Queer people looking for themselves in glossy pages on shelves around

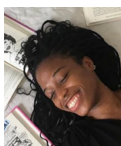
HOW DO I DRAW THESE MEMORIES?
