

After adventures with Shakespeare-quoting street kids, an introduction to sex work activism, and a powerhouse musical debut, Iph and Orr reunite, but a transformation has been set in motion. More YA titles with variously diverse characters: Radha and Jai's Recipe for Romance; American Betiya; Home is Not a Country; Donuts and Other Proclamations of Love.

The Dictionary of Lost Words by Pip Williams | Ballantine Books | 9780593160190 | \$37.00 HC | Fiction | 400 pages | April 2021 | A debut based on actual events: as a team of male scholars compiles the first Oxford English Dictionary, one of their daughters decides to collect the "objectionable" words they omit. Esme spends her childhood in the "Scriptorium," a garden shed in Oxford where her father and a team of lexicographers are collecting words. As she grows up, Esme realizes that words and meanings relating to women's and common folks' experiences often go unrecorded, so she searches out entries for her own Dictionary of Lost Words. In Vancouver, Daphne seems intent on destroying her life by self-medicating with drugs and alcohol. She is stuck in a clandestine affair with her married boss and still brooding on her marriage, which ended 12 years ago. Her tidy life is upended when a submission arrives from the woman who is now married to Liz's ex. Liz performs increasingly brutal edits of the essay, until she must face the harm she's causing others--and herself, leading to her attempts to make amends.
