
A child who looks different from her mother finds beauty and belonging in this new book from the creator of the *New York Times* bestseller *I Sang You Down from the Stars*


Chaiwala!

While the girl waits for her mug of milky spiced tea, readers are treated to the sights, sounds, and smells of the Chaiwala's cart. The aroma of ginger, cardamom, cloves, and cinnamon sticks swirls in the air. Tea leaves rustle, milk bubbles, and the hot drink is poured back and forth until—clink!—the cups are filled and placed on the stand. With a biscuit and a rusk added to their order, it's time to find a spot to sit and enjoy!

Inspired by the author's childhood visits to India, *Chaiwala!* celebrates the pleasures of taking time for food, family, and tradition—even for a brief moment.
